Summer Outings

How cheering on bleak February days to plan garden visits. There will as usual be two KHS coach outings this year:

Mottisfont - Friday 8th June

This is a National Trust property near Romsey in Hampshire. Alongside the remains of a medieval priory and the river Test, a wonderful collection of old fashioned roses has been created in the old walled garden. This is now designated the National Collection and it is justly famous. The outing will cost £15 for NT members, £23 for non members and as usual the coach will leave from outside the Coach and Horses on Kew Green at 9.30.

Sissinghurst - Tuesday 4th September

Also a National Trust property and even more famous than Mottisfont. Many members will have been already, but it is worth seeing many times and in every season, and since it is quite a long drive (at least one and a half hours) it would be good to let the coach take the strain. KHS members will be responsible for paying their own entry fee (\pounds 10) if they are not NT members or if they forget their NT card. Because of the journey we suggest a slightly earlier departure time of 9.15am, outside the Coach and Horses. Sissinghurst provides a 10-minute introductory talk but no guide; however the great pleasure of the garden is wandering about at one's own speed. The booking form will be in the July newsletter.

Other Events

"Happiness is Gardening" - Wednesday 25 April. Elizabeth Banks, President of the Royal Horticultural Society, will give a talk in aid of Integrated Neurological Services, a local based charity, which started in Kew, to help people throughout the borough suffering from neurological diseases including Parkinson's and strokes.
