From the Editor

Fritillaria: A photographic Journey to a Botanical Understanding by guest speaker Laurence Hill.



The above picture is a section of a larger piece that has recently been on show at the Shirley Sherwood Gallery in Kew Gardens. Laurence Hill is fascinated by Fritillaria has become a world expert on Fritallaria identification, research and conservation - collaborating with the Jodrell Laboratory at Kew with genetic research and looking at the evolutionary relationships in Fritillaria. During this talk, Laurence will share the stories and science contained within the life size images that he creates and the challenges faced acquiring, growing and illustrating the plants. For more than a decade Laurence has used digital technologies to

explore new ways of recording and presenting botanical science. The cornerstone of his exploration is an extensive living collection of more than 700 Fritillaria accessions.

Last year Laurence won a prestigious Gold Medal in the RHS Botanical Photography Category. His photographs were printed on rice paper and the format adopted is that of the old wood block prints of plants. They are simply beautiful and reflect Laurences drive for authenticity and understanding – so come along and hear what Laurence has already learned and how this passion is moving on and challenging traditional botanical illustration.

Finally the President, David Collison, thanked Jenny and Chris Long with Philippa Hurman for organising the quiz, those who provided the excellent supper, Celia Fisher for setting the questions, Chris White at the score-board and Gareth James for his role as quizmaster - friendly but firm! David also made a plea for volunteers to come forward to help with this year's Show in early September. Captain of the winning quiz team Harriet has been leading the Show Committee for the last three years but is stepping down. Her job will be divided and simplified in future but a replacement has yet to be found.

The evening made a profit of £350, which will help to subsidise the Show.

Day trip to Harold Peto's garden, Iford Manor near Bradford upon Avon. We will have lunch at The Courts Garden nearby. Harold Peto (1854-1933) was a garden designer and architect. Iford Manor was his own, beautiful, garden, on the south-west facing slopes of the River Frome. Italianate in style, his clever planting exuberating over a series of terraces, gently punctuated with wonderful statuary, this is one of the great British gardens. It exemplifies Peto's ability to marry formalism with the surrounding rural landscape. Please note that the site is set on a hillside and there are many steps.

For the afternoon, The Courts Garden (National Trust) has a fine collection of trees, some inventive topiary, magnificent water gardens, good planting, and lots to see and enjoy.
