The Summer Trip

KHS trip to Herefordshire, 4-8 July 2016, from £505 - see attached booking form – Appendix C

Once again Brightwater and KHS are going garden visiting together and once again the itinerary has been fine-tuned to suit KHS members' interests. A small group of us by chance visited a number of the gardens privately a few years ago and so were able to suggest some tweaks to the original itinerary.

We start off with The Laskett, Sir Roy Strong's famous garden created from scratch by him and his wife. This is on many members' list of must-visit gardens. We see Montpelier Cottage belonging to Noel Kingsbury, garden writer and plantsman, Hergest Croft Gardens, which has among other attractions a fine collection of trees, Lower Hopton Farm noted for its peonies, Stockton Bury, another plantsman's garden and wait till you

see the grotto, and an amazing garden with the wow factor in spades, Bryan's Ground, a garden created by its owners as a contemporary interpretation of an Arts and Crafts garden. For those who like to visit a house, Hampton Court Castle sits in massive grounds with a newly created modern garden surrounding it, no expense spared, created by one of the owners of Bryan's Ground incidentally as a design job so just see the difference between money and taste. Lower Hope Garden is said to be "dazzlingly colourful and very varied", and Misarden Park, originally designed in the 17th century, had Edwin Lutyens redevelop the gardens in the 20th century.

The group will stay in a hotel in Hereford and dinner will be served there every night.
