## Visit to the RHS Lindley Library – provisionally 8th October, to be confirmed

The RHS Lindley Library is situated at 80 Vincent Square, London SW1P 2PE and is the largest Horticultural Library in the world. The "Treasures of the RHS Lindley Library" is a 60-minute visit during which a member of the Library team will share a selection of rare books, wonderful botanical artwork and objects from their world class archives and photographic collections, either with interesting stories attached or that are particularly visually interesting, and with a focus on the Victorian era. #### **RICHARD WARD'S GARDENING TIPS**

Please check our website for Richard's gardening tips each month. Here are his March Tips:

"By early March I strive to complete outstanding winter work in the garden. On 18<sup>th</sup> February my Apricot was in flower - luckily I pruned and tied in last year's growths in late December. That's only an 8-week window for pruning between leaf fall and flowering.



Cut Dogwoods back really hard now if you want well-coloured stems for next winter. Prune overweight Olive trees - they respond well even after hard pruning. And Mimosas after flowering if they are becoming top heavy. Most evergreens can be cut back this month or next, after flowering as appropriate. Hydrangeas should be trimmed to remove old flowers either in late autumn or now, and if they are leggy they also usually respond well after cutting back hard, and will regenerate from near the base.

To prevent, or control weeds on hard-surface or gravel areas, spray with Glyphosate or similar, and always read the instructions. Avoid wind drift, and walking wet chemical over lawns. Better to do it now rather than later so that you don't finish up with a mass of browned/dead plant remains. Wait for a warmish, dry day. You might need a follow-up spray in June too.

If you have moss on hard-surface areas such as walls, paving, brickwork you should spray now, but on mild days, as it is more effective. Avoid treading the wet chemical onto carpets. Most moss will die and shrivel easily. Incidentally, most chemicals are best and more effectively and economically applied using a fine or medium high pressure sprayer, or bottle, rather than through a course watering can rose.

Take cuttings from Phlox and other herbaceous clumps now if you didn't get round to dividing them. Good luck. Richard.'


